

## **Police Committee Meeting August 13, 2015**

Susan Washa called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

Roll call Zach Washa, Ginger Halverson and Susan Washa. Daniel Swinehart was present as well.

Meeting was posted on August 11<sup>th</sup>. Susan Washa motioned that we the meeting is in compliance with open meeting law and Zach Washa seconded it. Motion Passed.

Discuss resolution to change speed limit from 35 mph on main street from Varsity lane north to the village limits. The committee read the resolution and had a discussion. If resolution NO 01, series 2015 does pass and is approved by the board the Iowa County Highway commission will have to either approve or deny the request because it is a state road.

A motion was made by Zach Washa to make the recommendation to the board to adopt resolution NO 01, series 2015 and it was seconded by Ginger Halverson. Motion carried.

Discuss Sex offender policy. This policy defines what needs to be done in the event that we receive notification from Iowa County that a sex offender will be released into the community. Motion by Susan Washa to recommend to the board to adopt the sex offender notification policy. Zach Washa seconded. Motion carried.

Discuss possible updates to weed ordination. No action needed. Daniel will talk to Eileen to update the policy to bring back before the board for approval.

Discuss Misc.

Discussed where the police car was parked and the need from some possible construction needed to stop the flow of water through the building. This will not happen now, but it maybe will be something that in the future we will have to look at.

Question was raised on how the firework permits work and why I am the one that signs off on them. Tom Michek, who is the fire chief, signs off on them and then Susan does as Village President. There was some question because one that came into the office this week and with the dry conditions how do we decide when it is a good idea. Susan stated that if the fire chief is good with the fireworks being lit off then we should be ok. There was no burn ban in effect and at the time of the fireworks we were listed at a low priority risk burn.

Ginger Halverson made a motion to adjourn at 6:39 p.m. and Zach Washa seconded it.
